André Anders is a Senior Scientist and Group Leader at Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory, Berkeley, California. He grew up in East Germany and studied physics in Wrocław, Poland, Berlin, Germany, and Moscow, Russia (then Soviet Union). He got his PhD in physics from Humboldt University, Berlin. From 1987 to 1991 he worked at the Academy of Sciences in East Berlin. The fall of the Berlin Wall gave him the opportunity to move to Berkeley, California, where he joined Berkeley Lab to work on plasma and ion beam technologies, mostly for materials applications. He is the author of more than 250 papers in refereed journals, author/editor of three books including the "Handbook of Plasma Immersion Ion Implantation and Deposition" (2000) and "Cathodic Arcs" (2008); his work is citied more than 7000 times. He is an Associate Editor of the Journal of Applied Physics and serves as Officer or Member on several Scientific Boards and Conference Committees. André is a *Fellow* of the American Physical Society (APS), American Vacuum Society (AVS), the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE), and the Institute of Physics (IoP).
